

FIELD TRIP RULES

Whale Watching Excursions

Please review these guidelines with your students in class before your field trip.

- Every student must submit a signed liability release form in order to attend the trip.
- **Students should wear comfortable, closed-toed shoes (no sandals).** They should dress in warm layers, and wear sunscreen and a hat.
- **Students should bring water (not juice or soda)** in a reusable water bottle.
- Students are strongly encouraged to take steps to prevent seasickness before coming to school the morning of the trip. They should discuss this information with parents/guardians using the Whale Watching Info Sheet (found in this User Guide).
- Students must adhere to all boat safety guidelines, which include absolutely no running, yelling, horseplay, or leaning over the side of the boat. Students are not permitted to climb-on any part of the boat and they should not linger near stairwells.
- Students are to remain seated for the first hour of the field trip and may not change seats. Students should be prepared to sit quietly and listen to a narration about the history of San Diego Bay.
- Students must get permission before going downstairs to use the restroom or moving around the top deck. Students may not visit the restroom unless accompanied by an adult.
- Students may take photos, provided that cameras do not cause a distraction to other students or a disruption to wildlife. **Students are not permitted to bring any type of electronic game or cell phone**.
- There will be other guests aboard the boat and students should be respectful and mindful not to crowd other passengers. They should not touch or speak to strangers.
- **Students will eat lunch at the conclusion of the field trip, around 12:00pm.** They should not eat before lunchtime so as to reduce the likelihood of seasickness.
- Students should not allow any objects to fall onto the boat deck or to blow overboard. During lunch they need to be mindful of their trash and leave the lunch area clean and tidy.
- **Students must stay with the group and follow directions** provided by Ocean Connectors instructors and boat crew members at all times.
- There is no guarantee that whales will be seen on every field trip. Students should understand that this is "the nature of nature" it can be very unpredictable. Regardless, participants will receive a meaningful educational experience and may get to see other wildlife such as birds, sea lions, and dolphins.
