

WHAT YOU WILL DO:

- 1. Empower youth with knowledge about diverse migratory marine species, fostering a deep understanding of the ocean's biodiversity.
- 2. Field trips with Ocean Connectors are not just classroom excursions; they are immersive adventures into nature.
- 3. Each grade level studying a different migratory marine species ensures a comprehensive understanding of various oceanic life forms.
- 4. Through these field trips, you instill a sense of responsibility and advocacy in young minds.
- 5. Volunteering on Ocean Connectors field trips allows you to build meaningful connections with both students and fellow volunteers.
- 6. By connecting youth to marine conservation, you are contributing to the creation of a generation that values and protects our oceans.

OUR FIELD TRIPS:

3RD GRADE TIDAL ZONE DISCOVERY

Learning about local tide pools in & outside the classroom.

4TH GRADE SEA TURTLE DISCOVERY

Visit Living Coast Discovery Center as students learn about the Eastern Pacific green sea turtle.

5TH GRADE WHALE EXPLORATION

Come aboard a Flagship Whale Watching Boat and teach students about the gray whale migration.

6TH GRADE BIRD & HABITAT STUDY

Take part in birding, habitat restoration, and a microscope lab at the San Diego Wildlife Refuge.

7TH GRADE SHARK INVESTIGATION

Aquarium visits or hands-on learning on the bayshore.


8TH GRADE OCEAN ACIDIFICATION


WHAT WILL YOU DO?

EVERY CLEANUP

Throughout the cleanups, our experienced guides will share insights about marine life, pollution, and the impact of your work. It's not just about cleaning; it's about understanding and preventing pollution.

Together, you'll witness the immediate impact of your efforts, leaving the environment cleaner and safer for marine life. You'll leave with a sense of accomplishment, knowing you've contributed to a healthier ocean. Plus, you'll be part of a community committed to ongoing conservation efforts!



KAYAK CLEANUPS

Expect a brief orientation session where safety guidelines and cleanup procedures are explained. Kayaks, paddles, and cleanup materials are all provided. You'll paddle near coastal wetlands in South Bay San Diego, collecting floating debris that are inaccessible from the shore. Wetlands are very sensitive habitats when it comes to pollution and climate change.

BEACH CLEANUPS

There will be a brief safety orientation regarding cleanup procedures. Then, you'll receive gloves, bags, and instructions on identifying & collecting debris. You'll explore the sands, gathering plastics, litter, and other waste. We will try to have you categorize what you find and sort the recyclables, landfill wastes, and e-wastes to aid in the sorting and disposal process.


